### ROAD RACE RETURNS!

After a two-year hiatus, we were excited to partner with the Hartford Marathon Foundation and participate in the Middletown 10K/5K Run or Walk event on Sunday, April 10th.

The response we received from participants, sponsors, volunteers, and fundraisers was amazing! Three hundred runners, walkers and volunteers showed up in support of mental health, wearing our bright "Who Will You Move For?" t-shirts. Before the race, we were treated to a song led by Rani Arbo; we cheered each other on at the finish line; and ended with a delicious lasagna lunch at our home base, First Church. It was a true joy to be in the community once again for this special annual event!

But we didn't stop there! We continued the fun with a weeklong virtual movement challenge. One hundred participants virtually moved with us - sharing photos or videos gardening, hiking and biking, as well as sharing their personal mental health stories, including Liz's story, "...I move to show myself and others that we can make it through anything, one step at a time."

The goal of this year's hybrid model was to increase access to those who were not able or comfortable participating in the in-person event. We used this opportunity to create an inclusive team with access to all – whether we ran a 5K or practiced chair yoga.
