Although Mike had participated as a fundraiser in the past, 2022 was the first time he attended. He accompanied and walked alongside L.M for as far as she was able. The plan was never to finish the race (or so he thought). L.M. has some physical challenges that cause her to be a fall risk and unstable while walking. Mike and L.M. were going to take their time, turn around when she was ready and just enjoy the day!

"She just kept going," Mike laughs. "We walked slow and at times she struggled, so we rested and took a break, but she had her mind set to get to the finish line." Mike asked her many times if she wanted to turn around but L.M. was motivated to keep going. "The further we walked, the more people joined to walk or cheer for us! No one pushed her to keep going, we just walked alongside. L.M. was totally self-motivated."

After the event, L.M. suffered from muscle soreness and sores on her feet for weeks. But that did not hamper her enthusiasm. She continued to talk about the day and finishing the race for months! L.M. has even inspired a friend to not only attend, but to cross that finish line with her in 2023.

Mike will be there walking with L.M. again. "This was very special for her. She's been empowered by crossing that finish line – not only that day but for the entire year!" Thanks L.M. for motivating and inspiring us! We will meet you at the finish line!

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

GRANT SPOTLIGHT: AMERICAN SAVINGS FOUNDATION

Gilead received a \$4,800 grant from the American Savings Foundation in support of Critical Incident Stress Management and Certified Clinical Trauma Professional training.

These trainings will aid our Mental Health Resource Center staff in addressing critical incidents in the community and with individual clients. Critical Incident Stress Management training is designed to address a recently experienced traumatic event, reducing the development of PTSD in the long term. Certified Clinical Trauma Professional training enables our clinicians to treat a person who is experiencing PTSD symptoms, using person-centered care techniques.

These trainings are also designed to provide staff with methods for their own self-care.

We thank the American Savings Foundation, for supporting our staff's professional development and positively impacting the communities we serve.
