2025: LISTENING, LEARNING & LEADING

CONVERSATIONS ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE ARE HAPPENING EVERY DAY. They're happening in schools, at dinner tables, online, and in the community; amongst peers, between generations, and across all levels of understanding and experience. In 2025, Gilead and our partners in the community did our part to engage in these conversations, educate about specific topics, and respond to the growing needs of our neighbors. We believe that it's important to meet people where they are and provide resources to support understanding in the moment.

COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS REQUIRE COMMUNITY COLLABORATION. In 2025, the community's piqued interest in deeper mental health topics resulted in larger events and discussions. It was an honor to be in conversation with Lisa Genova, an award-winning author and neuroscientist, at the inaugural Middletown Pages book festival. Lisa, whose stories artfully blend her scientific knowledge with a gift for storytelling, discussed her latest book, *More or Less Maddy*, which addresses a young woman's experiences and challenges with bipolar disorder.

It's no coincidence that Compassion Counts made its return with the event, "Stress & Anxiety, Oh My!" Gilead partnered with Community Foundation of Middlesex County, Durham Middlefield Youth & Family Services, Kuhn Employment Opportunities, Middlesex Health, Middlesex United Way, OnPoint Parenting, YMCA of Northern Middlesex County and River Valley Services to bring back Compassion Counts after a seven-year hiatus! Despite a rescheduling that pushed the event to a later date, over 80 community members attended. It's clear: people are talking about mental health.

AS A PROVIDER, IT'S IMPORTANT THAT GILEAD RESPONDS TO THE PRESENT NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY. We know that so many individuals in the mental health system encounter provider

changes after months of building strong relationships, and we understand the need for consistency and stability during recovery.

This is why the residential substance use treatment program, Farrell Treatment Center, now has the capacity to offer multiple levels of care – making it easy for individuals to transition to higher or lower levels within the same facility. Not only does this increase Gilead's ability to serve more individuals, but it means that more people can have peace of mind knowing that their same support system will be there for the next phase of the journey.

GILEAD IS PROUD OF THE WAYS OUR PROGRAMS AND STAFF CARE FOR OUR COMMUNITY. The CARF Accreditation that Gilead is eligible to receive every three years is a testament to the ways Gilead shows up. The Power of Art & Community to Heal



Last summer, many of our Gilead creatives came together to create a collaborative art installation designed to inspire hope, healing, and recovery. What began as an idea to visually represent Gilead’s mission through printmaking evolved into a powerful expression of creativity, connection, and community.

Led by Board Member Suzanne Gaskell, the resulting series, titled *Ripples of Change* featured seven collagraph prints. For many involved, the experience became far more than an art project. It offered a creative outlet, a sense of purpose, and an opportunity to share their voices. “I create art because it relaxes me when I’m having a hard time,” said one artist.

The installation was officially unveiled during a community celebration at the new gallery space at the Middletown Outpatient Clinic. In total, the exhibit showcased 52 original pieces of artwork alongside seven music and poetry performances, highlighting the depth of creativity within the Gilead community.

The project was made possible through the generous support of the broader community, including a grant from the Middletown Commission on the Arts, which funded professional framing. The gallery reflects a shared belief that healing happens in community—and that art can empower both the creator and the viewer.
